



ROYAL CLIPPER

With the success of the Star Clipper and Star Flyer, the luxury flagship Royal Clipper with her three story atrium was introduced in 2000. They are all owned by Mikael Krafft, a Swedish entrepreneur. The Royal Clipper is the first five-mast, full rigged sailing ship to be built since 1902; she was inspired by the historic "Preussen". Service is provided by international officers, staff and crew.

Guests aboard these yachts are affluent and well-traveled individuals who enjoy casual lifestyles. The unstructured nature of life aboard these vessels has strong appeal for them. Normally 50% of the passengers are from around the world and the balance is made up of North Americans, adding a true continental flavor onboard.

Built/Launched: July 2000, at Merwede Shipyard near Rotterdam, The Netherlands. The ship set sail in 2001. Royal Clipper is the flagship of the Star Clippers fleet.

Registry: Malta

Destinations: Royal Clipper spends the winter and spring in the Caribbean, repositioning to the Mediterranean for the summer and fall seasons.

Stateroom Amenities:

Two **Owner's Suites** at the ship's stern have interior stairway access from the Main Deck. Measuring 355 square feet, each has a lavish master bedroom with a marble bathroom, whirlpool bathtub, mini-bar, 24-hour in-cabin service, a sitting lounge worthy of the finest mega yacht and a separate double sleeping area with bath. The Owner's Suites may be connected and are available when the owner is not aboard.

Fourteen **Deluxe Suites**, each measuring 215 square feet, were the first with a private verandah on any sailing ship. The verandah has ample room for a pair of chairs and a table for outdoor relaxing or dining. The suite has a roomy double bed, which can be converted to two singles, and an adjacent sitting area overlooking the private verandah through a large window.

Deluxe Suites also have a large marble bath with tub and whirlpool, 24-hour in-cabin service, mini-bar and are finished with high-gloss dark woods.

Two **Deluxe Deck Cabins** sit side by side at the stern of the ship. Each measures 226 square feet and has a large window facing aft, and another of equal size facing the side deck with a view of the sea. Deck Cabins have a fixed double bed, whirlpool-equipped marble bathroom and mini-bar.

Ninety **Outside Double Cabins** are very roomy by sail ship standards at about 113-145 square feet. All are dressed in traditional polished dark woods and brass accessories, and most have luxurious double beds that can convert to singles.

Note: Twenty-seven of the Outside Double Cabins are convertible to triples by utilizing an additional upscale wooden framed bed that folds virtually out of sight during the day.

Six **Inside Double Cabins** each measure 108 square feet and have all the facilities of the Outside Double Cabins. There is a fixed double bed as well as an extra single bed that stores out of the way during the day.

All accommodations feature television, direct-dial phone, individual thermostat control, private safe, hair dryer, keyless entry, 220 volt (European) outlets and nightly turn-down service. The handsome wooden furniture in yacht-like fashion was created by Donald Starkey of England, who has designed all of the interiors and furnishings throughout Royal Clipper.

Dining Facilities:

The casually elegant **Clipper Dining Room** offers one, unhurried open-seating that can accommodate all passengers and officers at the same time. Breakfast and lunch are served buffet-style, while dinner is a sit-down culinary celebration. A spiral staircase beginning in the Atrium ends in the heart of the three-level dining room allowing for a dramatic entrance. The atmosphere is festive but never intimidating.

Facilities:

The Atrium – This is the first atrium on any true sailing ship. Sunshine streams through the glass bottom of the main swimming pool which serves as the ceiling to this midship passenger access to all public lower decks. The spiraling open-sided stairway clings to the Atrium's perimeter allowing access to passenger cabins and the retail shop. At night, the Atrium sparkles with illumination as sounds from the Piano Bar drift down to the dining room.

Captain Nemo Underwater Lounge – Another first for any ship is the unique underwater lounge, with floodlit underwater views through submarine portholes when the ship is at anchor. This lounge is a comfortable setting for observing the marine world.

Wellness Facility – Located within the Captain Nemo Underwater Lounge, this facility pampers passengers with a spa and fitness area, massage room and a skin and body treatment center.

Piano Lounge – When passengers first arrive, they enter the ship via this grand lounge that serves as the “town square” social center. Piano tunes can be heard throughout the day and into the evening as passengers socialize, take a spin on the dance floor or get cozy in a booth and enjoy a cocktail. The glass bottom of the largest of the ship’s pools protrudes gracefully into the room, with several underwater portholes adding to the charm.

Tropical Bar – This indoor/outdoor facility is the perfect venue to enjoy the fresh sea air and a beverage while lingering on deck. A cold-buffet breakfast is served at 6 a.m. for early risers awake to watch the sun rise.

Library – Located at the aft end of Main Deck, the Library takes passengers back into a time of old-world elegance that is the perfect setting for soft conversations, quiet reading or a small meeting. Browse the volumes for the latest novel or contemplate the next move during a game of chess, bridge or backgammon. Sea views abound in this literary oasis.

Forward Observation Lounge – Passengers simply unwind with a book or pleasant conversation. The lounge also hosts cocktail receptions and lectures.

E-mail – Two computers are located in the Observation Lounge for outgoing passenger e-mail and Internet.

Watersports – Jump into the sea from the back of the ship via the marina. Passengers can take advantage of complimentary snorkeling, sunfish sailing, waterskiing and windsurfing – all without having to go ashore. Scuba diving is available for a fee, and certification is required. Three outdoor pools are located on the Sun Deck.

Sailing Specials:

Lookout Stations – Created on each of the five masts some 60 feet above the Sun Deck. Stations have slatted teak deck, high safety rail and an all-weather comfortable teak settee for lounging while observing the action below. Passengers wishing to visit the Lookout Stations slip on a ship-supplied safety vest and a watchful crew member on the deck keeps the safety line taut as the guest makes the easy ascent up one of the ratlines.

Bow Sprit – Spread out like a great porous blanket ahead of the bow and supported by the bowsprit, the famed net is braided of heavy gauge netting line and the perfect spot for a secure nap, leisurely chat or unhurried read. Dolphins sometimes are visible below, seeming to brush their tails in play against the churning water at the bow of the ship.

Balconies – Not far ahead of the Bridge, these diminutive lookout spots with a high safety rail hold two people at a time. Constructed out of steel to extend out from both port and starboard, there is nothing but racing seas below.
